## Biodiversity Conservation as Corporate Responsibility: Private Sector and action to save orangutan Jamartin Sihite, BOSF Bogor, Indonesia

The orangutan is Asia's only great ape. Today orangutans only live on the islands of Borneo and Sumatra as two distinct species, and according to the IUCN Red Data List, the Bornean orangutan is classified as Endangered. *The conservation of orangutans calls for comprehensive and integrated efforts by all stakeholders to help save the man of the forest.* Both business and orangutan organizations can take concrete steps required to meet the goal of ensuring the long-term survival of the orangutan. The big question is how the private sector such as palm oil companies can take a significant and long-lasting role?
